## Uruguay

Dear Ones,

Thank you so much for standing with us these last two months. We have seen many blessings and lots of difficulties. It is very evident that there are spiritual battles. Your prayers play a significant part!

I will be leaving for the States on June 20<sup>th</sup> for 3 months. I will be in the Denver area, but the idea is to visit churches in Nebraska, Kansas and South Dakota. If you (either churches or individuals) are in these areas and I have not contacted you, please send me a note. (As you know I am going to the States more often now and trying to visit around half of my churches each time.)

With this trip coming up soon, I have lots of projects to finish up here and also lots to do to get ready to go. One of those projects are the classes at FEBU. The 7 gals in my Women in Ministry class have worked hard and we trust learned a lot to prepare them for present and future ministries. I have two more classes with them before leaving, then, due to scheduling, they will take their final exam after I leave.

We have the Kids' Bible Clubs one more time in each place, then break in July. Tim and Kari, my coworkers, will then continue the clubs in August. It is fun to see the kids arriving with desires to learn and grow. One of our little girls, Luciana, 7, lost her dad recently in a very tragic accident. Pray for these kids and their families as we seek to reach out to them.

I continue to have weekly Bible studies/discipleship classes with Eugenia and Mariela. They love the Lord and desire to live a life pleasing to Him. Speaking of Bible studies, the Lord opened the doors to have a weekly Bible study via the internet in a video conference call. This is primarily with the ladies from the church Monte Hebron, where I go on Sunday mornings. The idea is to have an evangelistic study of John to help the unsaved and newer ladies believe and grow, plus use it as a training class for the rest of the ladies. It seemed to have taken off on its own. From the first lady, Karen, expressing a desire for a class to learn and grow to the now 10 ladies participating. Some join us in the video conference, but others, due to work schedules or for other reason are not able to do so. I record the classes and make them available online for them as well. The idea is to continue these studies while in the States, as I am able.

One of the 10 ladies is Nancy, my unsaved neighbor. I had mentioned in my last letter that she had been attending the kids by-weekly Bible club here in San Jacinto. She continues to do so

and has attended the lady's teas when we have been able to have them in Tala. Please continue to pray for her, her family, and her many friends and contacts here in San Jacinto. There is a lot more I could tell you about but would like to close asking for your prayers for Pastor Adrian, his wife Virginia and their four little ones (7, 5, 4 and 1). I mentioned in my last letter that Virginia has a large tumor in her kidney. They have talked now for close to two months of the need to remove her kidney, but things have been very slow. Today, on Doctor's orders, she went to get an appointment at the Cancer Clinic (Public Health) and was not able to since she needed a written pass which the doctor had not given her. Please pray with us that step would be taken quickly to give her the attention that she needs.

Like I mentioned above, we are seeing God's blessings in many ways, but also difficulties in many areas as well. Pray with us for the victory that only He can give. Pray that His Name would be exalted.
