**Daily Personal/Church Life:** As I continue to spend time in God's Word, listen to podcasts or watch youtube sermons, I am constantly reminded of two things: 1) How dependent I am on God; 2) How providential and faithful He continues to be. Life for me still continues to be more passive than active, allowing extra time for some things that I wouldn't be able to do otherwise. I am currently staying at my home sending church's parsonage, and experiencing the blessing of "mostly normal" Church life. While we had resumed normal in-person services back in May, from November 8 through November 22, we had to return to online or virtual services thanks to multiple COVID cases in our congregation. **Please remember to pray for Calvary Baptist Church** as it is in all of our hearts to resume in-person services again as soon as possible.

**Furlough and Prefield:** Since returning to the US from Ghana in April, my intention has always been to visit and minister to supporters, reach out to potentially new supporters, attend Kingdom Air Corps in Alaska, and return to Ghana (Lord willing) within two years – possibly one and a half. All of those ambitions are still in the forefront of my mind and I am earnestly praying for God to still bring them to pass. Of course, God has willed a unique path for me this year, one I would have never

planned for. **Please pray for me as I seek to resume those same plans in 2021.** With the recommendations of both my doctor and my ABWE regional director, I have resumed some of my furlough/prefield ministry, but at a much slower rate. By God's grace alone, I have been able to visit several churches beginning in October and finishing this month in November. This will be my first family holiday season (Thanksgiving through New Years) since 2018! Therefore, December has remained schedule free as I have family events scheduled throughout and more simple recovery time. **I am currently planning and praying towards spending most of January and February in Kansas if the Lord allows it.** I will be able to finish visiting my supporting churches and visit a couple new ones should the "doors be opened" during that time.

**Vehicle Accident:** My head seems to be mostly back to normal. No one has told me that I'm insane anyway 😊 I continue to deal with a few prolonged symptoms. For instance, after speaking (preaching or presenting) I get headaches for the rest of the day and through the following day. I continue to have low stamina, although I have gained some back! Chronic aches remain in the left side of my face, and the pupil in my left eye remains over-dilated. Please continue to pray for healing.
