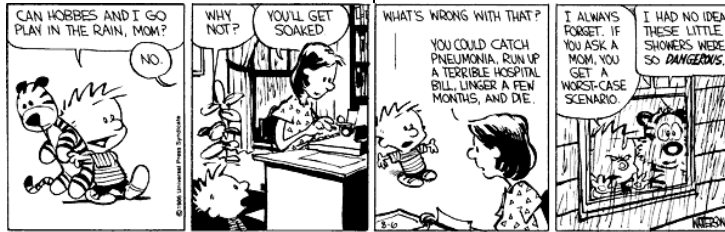
Monthly Feature: Playing Catch-Up!!
