This is Dzakumah Eyome. He is 23 years old and has been around the BATA campus ministry work in Ho for the last several years. He lived in Kodzobi (10 minutes from the campus) and has sat under the teaching of God's word both at BATA and a church

nearby. He works on vehicles and machinery, and has, over the last three years, served as the primary



mechanic at the BATA campus. He has been a wonderful blessing to the work as he has also been teaching the youth at Dzakpo Church and visiting the unreached Fulani in a Fulani "camp" about an hour trip the campus. He is currently living on the campus and continuing in those responsibilities. **Meet Prosper Amevor**. He is 22 years old and is a part of the Grace Baptist Church plant in Ho. He's been living in the dorms and working on the campus helping with



upkeep. He has been a big part of campus ministry from BATA Kids Club to Youth Leadership Academy. He plays the piano for church and BATA events, loves to work with slide shows and

spreadsheets, and is one of the youth leaders at Grace Baptist Church. He is currently attending school to finish his education.

campus. Godsway has been a part of Grace Baptist for many years and has taken classes at the Bible school. He ministers at Grace Baptist Church
